4th of July Holiday this Thursday: Remember God gave us freedom in our country not to do what we want in a selfish way, but to use it to serve Him and others in charity and goodness. Pray for all Americans to understand this essential truth and responsibility.

A reminder: There will no daily Mass from Tues-Thurs and no Holy Hour on Weds.

1st Friday and 1st Saturday Mass: I will have 8 am Mass on 1st Friday (see last weekend's bulletin column on that) with adoration until 9:30 am, and the normal 3 pm Divine Mercy Holy Hour; and then on 1st Saturday at 8 am. Attend for all the graces.

June 30, 2024 – 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our readings today remind us that our God is a tender and loving God. Our First Reading, from the book of Wisdom, helps answer a common question in our Catholic faith — why is there suffering and death? We are tempted to be angry at God for the death of loved ones or of innocent people. We are also tempted to be angry at Him for our sufferings — like illness, car troubles or a terrible week at work. Wisdom teaches us, "God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living." Rather, "God formed man to be imperishable; the image of his own nature he made him."

Whether we are healed like the little girl in our Gospel today in this life, or we carry our suffering with us until we reach the next, if we remain faithful, Jesus will one day say to us, "Little girl or little boy, I say to you, arise!" Today, let us reflect on how much our good and gracious God loves us. Remember that whatever we are suffering in this life, do not be afraid, God is right there with us. Offer it to Him, seek His healing and remain faithful so that one day we might rise.

MARRIAGES: The Sacrament of Matrimony requires a time of Preparation. Arrangements are to be made with the Priest of the Parish nine months before the date of marriage. Your church date and time are to be set prior to your reception date and time. The Pre-Cana Conferences or Engaged Encounter must be part of the marriage preparation. Either the bride or the groom or both must be a registered and practicing member of St. Thomas parish. To make Marriage Preparation arrangements in the parish, call 623-5526.

Children of parishioners are reminded that they are removed from their parents' registration upon their 22nd birthday and must register as an adult member of the parish.
